

The arrangement of this parts catalog is for easy identification of parts. All parts are illustrated in exploded views in proper relation to each other. Some diagrams refer to other pages for further information. Reference numbers used in the illustrations refer to line numbers in the part lists. The part lists appear to the right or below all diagrams and correspond with those diagrams. Included in the part lists, along with the reference numbers are part numbers, part descriptions and the quantity of the part required per Wrap Twine Remover System.

ABBREVIATIONS

SN “Serial Number” refers to the serial number given to each WTR410/WTR510 by Hillco Technologies. See above for the Wrap Twine Remover System’s serial number location. This abbreviation is used interchangeably in both instances. Each Model WTR410/WTR510 uses the following serial number format:
xxxx (sequential numbers).

ASM “Assembly” refers to a whole grouping of parts (shown in the diagram corresponding with the page where “ASM” is shown unless otherwise noted). Some assemblies have parts that are sold separately, however some must be purchased as a single unit. Hillco Product Specialists will be able to assist you with any questions.

NS “Not Shown” refers to a part that is not depicted in the illustration.

RIGHT AND LEFT IDENTIFICATION

The reference to right-hand and left-hand in this catalog is identified by the operator sitting in the operator’s seat, looking toward the front of the machine (in normal forward travel).

PART ORDERS

Orders must specify product model, serial number, correct part number, complete description, quantity required, method of shipment, shipping address, and billing address.





Statement of Limited Warranty

Class II Warranty

Parts & Labor

Hillco warrants its Class II products to be free from defects in material and workmanship for a period of twelve (12) consecutive months following the warranty start date.

The warranty start date for Hillco Class II products is the date of the invoice, or the first date of use, whichever is earliest. Once the warranty period has begun, it cannot be stopped.

Hillco warrants genuine Hillco replacement parts and components to be free from defects in material and workmanship for a period of ninety (90) consecutive days following the Hillco invoice date, or the remainder of the original equipment warranty period, whichever is longer.

Complete the Warranty claim form and submit the claim, via email to warranty@hillcotechnologies.com within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of the failure and within the warranty period.

All warranty work must be performed, and claims submitted, within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of the claim and within the warranty period.

All parts removed during warranty repair should be held for a period of sixty (60) days after the warranty claim has been submitted to Hillco.

Hillco reserves the right to either inspect the product at the original retail purchaser's location, or the authorized Hillco's dealer's location; or require it to be returned to Hillco, transportation charges prepaid, for inspection.

2. Make sure that all controls are in the neutral position before starting the tractor.
3. Clear the area of all bystanders, especially children, before starting the system and during operation.
4. Make sure all safety shields are in place before operating the Wrap Twine Remover. Never operate the machine with the shields removed.
5. Keep hands, feet, hair and clothing away from all moving and/or rotating parts.
6. Stay seated in the cab during operation.
7. Operate controls only when sitting in the seat of the tractor.
8. Always travel at a safe speed. Use caution when making turns or traversing ditches.

HYDRAULIC SAFETY

1. Do not search for high-pressure hydraulic leaks without hand and face protection. A tiny, almost invisible leak can penetrate the skin, thereby requiring immediate medical attention.
2. Use cardboard or wood to detect leaks – never your hands!
3. Before inspecting the hydraulic system of the Wrap Twine Remover system, install the safety stops where applicable.
4. Before operating the WTR, ensure that there are no obstructions between or around the arms.
5. Maintain proper hydraulic fluid levels.
6. Ensure all fittings and hoses are in good repair.






SERVICING AND MAINTENANCE SAFETY

1. Review the Operator's Manual and all safety items before servicing or maintaining the Wrap Twine Remover.
2. Stop the engine, wait for any moving parts to stop, block the tires, and the cylinder areas before servicing, repairing, adjusting, or maintaining the Wrap Twine Remover system.
3. Place Selector switch to middle position and set hydraulics to float (if possible) to relieve system pressure.
4. Hydraulic oil is under pressure. Use caution when dealing with the hydraulic system.
5. Keep hands, feet clothing and hair away from all moving and/or rotating parts.
6. Clear the area of bystanders, especially children, when carrying out any maintenance, repairs or making any adjustments.

HIGHWAY OPERATION AND TRANSPORT SAFETY

1. Check with local authorities regarding transport on public roads. Obey all applicable regulations and laws.
2. Check clearance elevations and widths of implement for travel near power lines, bridges, trees, etc.
3. Always travel at a safe speed. Use caution when making corners or meeting traffic.
4. WTR is not designed to transport bales long distances on public roads.


Safety Labels

Familiarize yourself with the location of all safety labels. Read them carefully to understand the safe operation of your machine.

TO APPLY NEW OR REPLACEMENT LABELS

1. Make sure the label area is smooth by removing any debris such as dirt or old labels.
2. Wash the area with soap and water and then dry it thoroughly.
3. After the area has completely dried, peel the backing off the safety label and place it onto the cleaned area.
4. Make sure all areas of the label have adhered to the machine by pressing down on the entire face of the label, including the corners.









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

Hydraulics, Electrical, and Implement connections.


Attach the Wrap Twine Remover to your loader as per the instructions in your loader's Operator's Manual. Connect the two hydraulic hoses to the service ports on the loader tractor. (If your tractor is not equipped with service ports at the front of the loader you can route hoses from the rear of the tractor, these hoses are not included in the kit.) Connect the electrical plug near the manifold and the system will be ready for use.




Operation:

The WTR has three functions controlled by a switch box in the cab.

Bale Squeeze – Used to squeeze the bale and position the hooks and knife into position to grab and cut the bale twine/wrap.



Rotate – Used to rotate the squeeze arms out of the way when handling bales that are tightly stacked.



Cut – Cycles a series of hooks on the left arm and a knife on the right arm. The hooks grab into the bale and capture the twine/wrap while the knife simultaneously cuts the twine/wrap.




NOTICE

If WTR power is connected to permanent power, leave the switch in the center (rotate) position to avoid draining the battery.




Best Practices

Spear the bale so that the arms are located at the widest point on the bale.




Make sure the bale is against the WTR frame.

Position the bale squeeze arms so that they are level with the bale.



Engage the knife and hooks and leave engaged holding the wrap/twine. Select Bale Squeeze on switch and open the arms to put some tension onto the wrap/twine. Select Rotate and rotate the arms upward to pull the wrap free from the bale. Then tip the bale downward and allow it to slide forward off the spears. Discard wrap/twine in garbage.






Adjustments

Hook Adjustment

The hook bank can be moved in/out of the hook arm to adjust how deep the hooks are reaching into the bale. For twine wrapped bales it is best to have the hooks reach further into the bale to ensure they get each string. For round bales with net wrap the hooks can be adjusted outwards to reduce the amount of hay that is trapped by the hooks.

Located hook adjustment bolts A & B. Use a 9/16 socket to adjust.





Important Notes when adjusting the hooks:

Turning the below bolts clockwise will adjust the hooks further into the bale.

Turning the below bolts counter clockwise will adjust the hooks further away from the bale.

When adjusting adjust in small increments and also adjust each side evenly. It is recommended to adjust bolt A two revolutions and then adjust bolt B two revolutions so the hook cartridge does not bind up.



Important Do not use an electric or air impact gun to adjust hooks. This will cause the hooks to bind. Use hand ratchet only.



Arm Position

There are two settings for arm mounting location.




If only handling round bales we recommend placing the arms in the narrow position.

The maximum bales size in the narrow position is 101.5"

If handling large square bales that are 8' in length we recommend the wide position.

The maximum bales size in the wide position is 111.5".

To adjust the arms to the alternate position remove the (4) M12 bolts (A) and nuts on each side and move the arm to the other position.




Chain Adjustment - Maximum Width

Adjust chains to optimize opening width to accommodate bale size.

The hydraulic cylinders for the squeeze are plumbed in parallel so which ever arm has the least resistance will open first and open all the way before the second arm moves. The chains limit however far the first cylinder moves increasing opening time to the desired width.

Adjust the chains (B) so the arms open enough to easily handle the bales width.



Knife blade replacement

Use the following procedure to safely remove the knife cartridge for blade replacement

Open the arms at least 1 foot from their fully closed position then shut off the vehicle engine and remove the key.



WARNING

The knife blade is very sharp! Wear proper protective equipment while handling the knife.

Cycle the knife and stop the knife when it is sticking out of the arm. Use duct tape and apply tape to the sharp edge of the knife to prevent injury. Do not touch the knife blade as it is sharp.

After taping cycle blade so the rod holes for the cylinder line up with the cutouts on the arm so the pin can be removed.




Disconnect the rod end of the cylinder (A) from the knife cartridge.

Careful to not move the knife cartridge as the blade can then protrude past the arm.

If equipped with the net wrap hook, open the front access cover (C) and disconnect the struts from the rocker assembly. The struts will be removed with the knife cartridge.



NOTICE

If the blade is cycled while the safety pin is in place, irreparable damage will occur.






Remove the six bolts (A) from the inside face of the cartridge then remove the cartridge (B) taking extra care to ensure that the knife blade remains inside the cartridge. You will have to tip the cartridge downward to clear the arm frame.



Set the cartridge on a sturdy work surface and remove the linkages (C) that connect the knife holder to the cartridge.




Slide the knife holder forward then rotate to remove the knife holder from the cartridge frame as shown.





Using a T30 wrench remove the screws (A) holding the blade to the knife holder. When re-installing the blade make sure to match the angle of the blade to the angle of the knife holder at the front and rear. Use locktite on all bolts and tighten them to 75 in-lbs.



Assembly is the reverse of the process above.



Hook replacement

Use the following procedure to safely remove the hook cartridge for hook replacement.




CAUTION

Be aware of pinching hazards while handling the hook cartridge.


Open the arms at least 1 foot from their fully closed position. Ensure that the hooks are fully retracted. Shut off the vehicle engine and remove the key.



Disconnect the rod end of the cylinder from the hook cartridge.




Remove the six bolts (B) from the inside face of the cartridge then remove the cartridge.






Set the cartridge on a sturdy work surface. The hooks can be removed one at a time by removing the two bolts (A) that attach them to the pivot frame and actuator arm. It is recommended that you replace the bushing when replacing the hook.



Remove the bolt (B) that connects to the linkage and the bolt (C) that the hook rotates around. Remove and replace bushing along with new hook.



When re-installing the hooks, tighten the bolt (C) that passes through the pivot bushing snugly but only tighten the bolt (B) on the actuation arm tight enough that the bolt can still be turned freely by hand. If the bolts to the actuation arm are too tight the mechanism can bind.

Assembly is the reverse of the process above.






Spear Installation

The WTR comes with two upper (A) and an optional five lower (B) spear locations. Up to seven spears in any combination can be installed. Three spears are included. An additional fourth spear is included with the optional lower mount.

To remove the spears use a wrench to hold the square part of the spear and a socket to remove the nut.


When reinstalling the spears it is recommended to put anti seize on tapered part of spear to prevent it from rusting into the housing.



Maintenance

Every 200 HRS


Lubricate all 4 sides of both arms (A) with a dry graphite where they slide in and out. Do this prior to the initial use and every 200 bales or as needed.



Adjust poly wear pads (B) to reduce slop over time as WTR is used. With arms fully extended tighten so there is no slack between poly pad and arm (two on each side).

Lubricate pivot bushings (C) on each side with dry graphite every 200 bales.

Grease pivot cylinder ends (D) every 200 bales.



Annual Maintenance

Inspect blade for damage/wear. Replace if damaged.

Inspect hooks for damage.

If bent straighten or replace hook.

If broken replace hook.

Setup

Read this prior to beginning the setup procedure:

Due to the variety of different loader options on the market, the WTR is shipped without service hoses from the manifold to the loader hydraulics. Secondly, if your tractor does not have auxiliary hydraulics at the loader then hoses from the rear remotes will need to be routed to the WTR. It is advisable to have these hoses made prior to beginning the system setup.

Hillco recommends a 3/8 inch service hose with 90° -8 (1/2") SAE Oring Face seal fittings on one end and the quick coupler option of your choice on the other end.

Step 1:

Unpackaging and Inventory:

Unpack the WTR system, including the boxed items, and compare the items to the inventory list below. If there are any damaged or missing items contact Hillco Technologies, Inc. at 1-800-937-2461 for assistance.



Step 2:

Rotating the center assembly:

Using one of the spears as a lever, rotate the center assembly upwards to provide access to the rear of the frame.



The spear can rest against the ground to help stabilize the center assembly.







Step 3:

Installing service hoses:

Locate and remove the two caps from the fittings on the rear of the manifold. (It may be easier to remove the manifold cover using a T45 torx bit).



Connect the hoses to the fittings at the rear of the manifold, then route the service hoses towards the right side of the center frame. The hoses should exit under the right side of the manifold cover. (B)







Step 4:

Installing loader adapter


Locate the loader adapter kit. It should include a left and right adapter plate of your choice along with 12ea. $\frac{3}{4}$ -10 x 1-3/4 bolts and nylock nuts. (A) Position the left plate between the mounting ears at the rear of the frame and install the 6 bolts from the inside and start the lock nuts. Tighten all nuts using an impact wrench and repeat this process for the right plate.

Note: The skidsteer mount is shown, your kit may vary.




Step 5:

Pick up the center frame and secure it to your loader tractor.





The knife arm is usually on the right side of the machine and the hooks arm is on the left as you sit in the machine. They can be switched. If you prefer to switch them contact Hillco for an additional set of safety decals as the decals will be facing the other direction. Instances where operators have switched the arms usually relate to the tractor position when cutting wrap trying to keep the wrap further away from tub grinders.



Step 6:

Installing Knife Arm.

Cut the zip tie (B) holding the arm hoses in place and set the hoses out of the way for now.



Lower the center frame with your loader tractor and position the arm near the right side mount plate so that it can be bolted in place.

There are two positions to install the arms. The narrow position (shown) is optimal for round bales, while the wide position is intended for large square bales that are 8 feet long or longer.


See Arm Adjustment Section for more details on arm width.

Locate the (4) 3/4 x 2.5" bolts (B) and 3/4" stover nuts.

Install arm to center frame using the 3/4" bolts and nuts.

Torque to 380 ft-lbs


Step 7: Hook Arm Installation

Install the hook arm position so it matches the position the knife arm.

Locate the (4) 3/4 x 2.5" bolts (A) and 3/4" stover nuts.

Install arm to center frame using the 3/4" bolts and nuts.

Torque to 380 ft-lbs






Step 8:

Installing hose guides:

Locate the 4 hose guides (A) from the box as well as (6) 5/16 x 3.5" bolts (B) and 5/16 nylock nuts.

Install the hose guides as shown and tighten. Note that the bolts must be left loose enough to allow the guides to move freely as the arm extends and retracts.

Repeat this process on the opposite side.





Step 9:

Connecting arm cylinder hoses.

Route the hoses from the center frame, over the top of the guides, and through the two holes in the top of the arm. Connect them to their corresponding ports on the arm cylinder. The ends of the hoses are different to prevent connecting them incorrectly. Note: You may need to loosen the opposite ends of these hoses to get any twists out.



Zip tie the hoses to the guides then tighten all connections near the arm cylinder.





Installing electrical.

Find a convenient location inside the cab to mount the switch box and secure it using the provided Ram mounts. You will need to provide 12 volts – 5 amps to the orange wire and ground to the black wire. Hillco recommends connecting the switch box to a keyed power source to avoid accidentally draining your tractor's battery if the switches are left on.




Route harnesses on the inside of the loader frames to protect the harnesses.





Connect the extension harness to the manifold harness (already installed) then route the free end down the side of your loader to the switch box in the cab and connect the two together. Be sure to secure the harness with zip ties so it won't rub or pinch as the loader is used.



Startup

Please read through the following procedure fully prior to attempting the first startup of your WTR.

NOTE: if your tractor is rated for more than 12 GPM of Hydraulic Flow we recommend reducing the hydraulic flow. Refer to your tractor's operator's manual to reduce flow.

Rotate:



Make sure there are no people standing near the unit. Start the tractor, verify the switch box is in the center position, then slowly provide oil to the WTR. If nothing happens, try reversing the hydraulics. The arms should slowly rotate upwards as you apply oil. Once the arms have rotated fully upwards, slowly reverse the hydraulic flow to lower them. Repeat 3 or 4 times to remove all air from the cylinder. It is important to do this step slowly until all air is removed from the system to prevent the arms from rotating too fast and damaging the cylinder.

Squeeze:



Change the switch to the bale squeeze position (A red light should illuminate on the switch). Provide oil to the WTR. If nothing happens slowly reverse the flow. The arms will start to extend, most likely one at a time. It is normal for the arms to chatter as the air is bled from the system. Once the arms are fully extended, Hillco recommends that a dry lubricant, such as graphite, be sprayed liberally onto the arm tubes. Cycle the arms fully 3 or 4 times to purge all air from the system.

Cut:



Change the switch to the cut position. (A red light should illuminate on the switch). Double check no one is standing near the WTR, then slowly provide oil. As before, if nothing happens try reversing the flow. If you position the loader properly, you can see the hooks and knife deploy.

Note that the knife blade is shipped with tape over it for safety. Now is a good time to carefully remove the tape from the knife edge. The best way to do this is to slowly cycle the cut mechanism and stop as the blade is exposed. This will provide access to remove the tape. Cycle the knife and hook 2 – 3 times to purge air from the system.


Shut down the tractor engine and inspect the WTR for any oil leaks. Hillco also recommends checking the hydraulic fluid level on tractor.






Supply hoses from tractor to WTR are not included. Manifold fittings are -8 (1/2") flat face oring.






WTR410 FOR 4' DEEP ROUND BALES AND 4' LARGE SQUARE BALES



WTR510 FOR 5' DEEP ROUND BALES




Hydraulic Schematic






In the picture above, if the green hoses are pressurized, the reaction will be to retract the arms, squeezing the bale. If the purple hoses are pressurized, the reaction will be to extend the arms, releasing the bale.





In the picture above, if the green hoses are pressurized, the arms will rotate up. If the purple hoses are pressurized, the arms will rotate down.






In the picture above, if the green hoses are pressurized, the left-hand cylinder will extend and the hooks will deploy, while at the same time the right-hand cylinder will retract, and the knife blade will cycle forward cutting the strings. If the cover edge hook is present, it will extend at this time. If the purple hoses are pressurized, the left-hand cylinder and hooks will retract, while at the same time the right-hand cylinder will extend, and the knife blade will cycle rearward. If the cover edge hook is present, it will retract at this time.




Electrical Schematic



Electrical Theory of Operation

When the switch is in the Rotate position (B), no power is supplied to any of the coils at the hydraulic manifold. Valves #1 and #3 are normally closed and valve #2 is normally open. When the switch is moved to the Squeeze Position (A), 12V power goes to both the Green and Red wires. The Green wire opens valve port #1 and the Red wire closes valve port #2 diverting oil flow to the Squeeze cylinders. When the switch is moved to the Cut/Grab position (C), 12V power goes to both the White and Red wires. The White wire opens valve port #3 and the red wire closes valve port #2 causing hydraulic flow to go to the Cut/Grab cylinders.
